TO: ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND INDIVIDUALS:

This is to give notice that Fayette County, PA has conducted evaluations as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, to determine the potential affect that its activities listed below, and any future similar projects in Fayette County, PA , which are located in floodplains/wetlands, will have on the human environment:

FY2015 CDBG Program C#000064200:

(FY2015-ER-CEST-10) - This activity invloves road reconstruction along existing roads located in the Filbert-Fairbank Area in Redstone TWP, Fayette County, PA. The total number of linear feet involved in a floodplain is approximately 880 LF.

FY2016 CDBG Program C#0000TBD:

(FY2016-ER-CEST-02) - This activity involves recreation improvements located at Dunbar Borough Park in Dunbar Borough, Fayette County, PA. The area involved in a floodplain is less and one acre.

(FY2016-ER-CEST-16) - This activity involves street imrovements (road reconstruction/storm) located in the Meadowbrook Area in South Union Township, Fayette County, PA. The total number of linear feet involved in a floodplain is approximately 500 LF.

FY2013 CDBG Program C#000057661:

(FY2013-SU-ER-CEST-01) - This activity involves street imrovements (road reconstruction/storm) located in the Meadowbrook Area in South Union Township, Fayette County, PA. The total number of linear feet involved in a floodplain is approximately 500 LF.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.
