

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR GRANT MODIFICATIONS  
OF FAYETTE COUNTY, PA AND OBO  
DUNBAR AND SOUTH UNION TOWNSHIPS  
FY2016-2017 and 2019 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAMS**

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing to obtain the views and comments of citizens on community development needs will be held on **August 21, 2020** at 9:30am. Due to the COVID-19 crisis, this meeting will be held online at: <https://join.freeconferencecall.com/racf>. Every effort will be made to provide the needed materials to all residents, including persons with disabilities and LEP persons, upon request. Please call 724-437-1547 ext. 210 at least 72 hours in advance of the hearing to request technical assistance.

The hearing will address proposed modifications to the County's FY2016, 2017, and 2019 funded activities for the following four (2) Entitlement Townships: Dunbar and South Union. Proposed modifications will reallocate the balances of completed and/or cancelled projects to new and/or previously approved activities as follows:

- Dunbar Township (FY2016, 2017, 2019) – 1) Move funding from a cancelled road reconstruction project along Cottage Avenue and completed projects along Brick, Laurel and Pine streets to Frick Lane and Wheeler Area Road Reconstruction projects, 2) Move the balance of funds from completed road reconstruction projects in the Seaton Hill Road and Mahoning Road Areas to road reconstruction in the Wheeler Area, and 3) Move funds from Housing Rehabilitation to Wheeler Area Road Reconstruction.
- South Union Township (FY2016-2017) – 1) Move a balance in funding from a cancelled road project in the Jamison-South Mount Vernon Ext Area and completed road reconstruction projects in the Everheart Drive Area and along Brownfield Road to Lieth Area Road Reconstruction.

The hearing may include discussion of other past and future uses of CDBG funds. CDBG funds are provided to the county and its entitlement townships from the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) and may be utilized for a variety of community development and housing activities. Seventy percent (70%) of available funds must benefit low- and moderate-income persons. These proposed activities plan for no displacement of any persons or affordable housing units. It is the stated policy of the County and its Entitlement Townships to avoid activities which result in displacement. In the unlikely event any activity funded by the CDBG program results in displacement, it is the responsibility of the County and / or Township to provide relocation assistance.

All interested agencies, groups and persons wishing to comment on the proposed modifications or any of the County's community development needs and use of CDBG funds may submit written remarks to the attention of Andrew French, Executive Director at the Redevelopment Authority of the County of Fayette, PA (86 West Main Street, Uniontown PA 15401) by the end of day, **August 24, 2020**. Each municipality will consider approval of the proposed modifications at their regular September meetings. The County Commissioners will consider final approval at their next public meeting on **September 17, 2020** at 10am.
